# Children's Heart Foundation

## Introduction

The Children's Heart Foundation (CHF) was originally formed as a mutual support group for parents with children suffering from congenital heart disease. The parents realized that sharing experiences and information was a great benefit to all concerned. In 1994, with the support of doctors, nurses and medical social workers at the Cardiac Paediatric Unit of the Grantham Hospital, the CHF was founded as a registered charitable organization devoted to supporting children suffering from heart disease and their families.

Over the past 24 years, the Foundation has grown from a small group of volunteers into an organization which has a team of full-time staff and subcommittees specializing in different issues related to children with heart disease. As our organization depends entirely on public support and donations, the volunteers and supporters remain the backbone of the Foundation and the reason for its continuous success.

### Objectives

1. To provide financial and psychological support to families with children suffering from congenital heart disease.
2. To raise public awareness about congenital heart disease.
3. To support the development of technology and methods to detect and treat congenital heart disease.

## Services

### **1. Financial support for families**

Patients have to pay for treatments and equipment such as special catheters and pacemakers which are not covered by government. The CHF has helped hundreds of less well-off families through its Medical Financial Support Scheme to ensure children receive appropriate treatment.

### **2. Purchase of medical equipment**

New technology and medical breakthroughs are an essential part of improving treatment. The CHF helps upgrade existing facilities and services by purchasing the latest high-tech equipment, supplementing the services provided by the public hospitals.

### **3. Counseling services**

All parents expect their baby to be born healthy. When they are told their child has a heart problem, the first reaction is fear; fear of the unknown and fear about the future. Mum and dad are full of questions-What's wrong with my baby? What will happen next? Why did this happen? What treatment does the child need? The CHF provides counseling and support services for parents who need help.

### **4. House of the Heart**

When a child is admitted to hospital for heart surgery or treatment, parents face enormous difficulties and endure great stress. The House of the Heart (HOH) allows parents to get a good night sleep and spend more time with their children. They can freshen up during the day or just take time out to relax. It also reduces the amount of time parents spend travelling to and from the hospital.

In accordance with the Queen Mary Hospital redevelopment, the HOH has been relocated to Wah Kwong House Wah Fu Estate. Internet and Wi-fi service is now available at the HOH, while parents can also prepare simple dishes for their children. To facilitate the counseling service, a play room is established as well.

## Services

### **5. Educational programmes**

Most people have never heard of congenital heart disease, despite it being one of the most common congenital problems among children. Through various educational programmes and exhibitions, the CHF promotes public awareness about heart health and raises support in the community and schools for these special children. The CHF also organizes talks so parents can learn more about caring for children with heart disease, nutritional issues and child development.

### **6. Parents support group**

There are many different types of problems associated with congenital heart disease. Caring for these special children can be difficult and stressful, so talking to people who have the relevant experience, knowledge and understanding can give parents a sense of belonging. Parents can often feel helpless, so it is real comfort to be able to share their anxiety with others who have been through a similar experience. The CHF works to promote self help and mutual support between these families. Parents can share their experiences at the wards, in the support group meetings and during other activities. This is an effective way of enhancing communications between parents at a very difficult time.

### **7. Ward visits**

Hospitalization is always stressful and painful for both the children and their families. Unfortunately, spending time in hospital is a common occurrence for children with heart disease, Ward visits by professional team and trained volunteers are essential as they stimulate the children's development and facilitate positive thinking among parents. Volunteers help with artwork, reading and storytelling, while parent volunteers share their personal experiences, giving other parents the confidence to face the challenges ahead.



## Services

### **8. Developmental programmes**

Because of their physical limitations, some children with heart disease encounter learning problems which affect their education, social lives and psychological development. The CHF organizes a variety of programmes like the choir. As they have a lot in common, the children feel comfortable taking part in these activities together. The CHF also organizes outdoor and indoor activities such as camping to strengthen the parent-child relationship and boost self confidence.

### **9. Medical development and exchange**

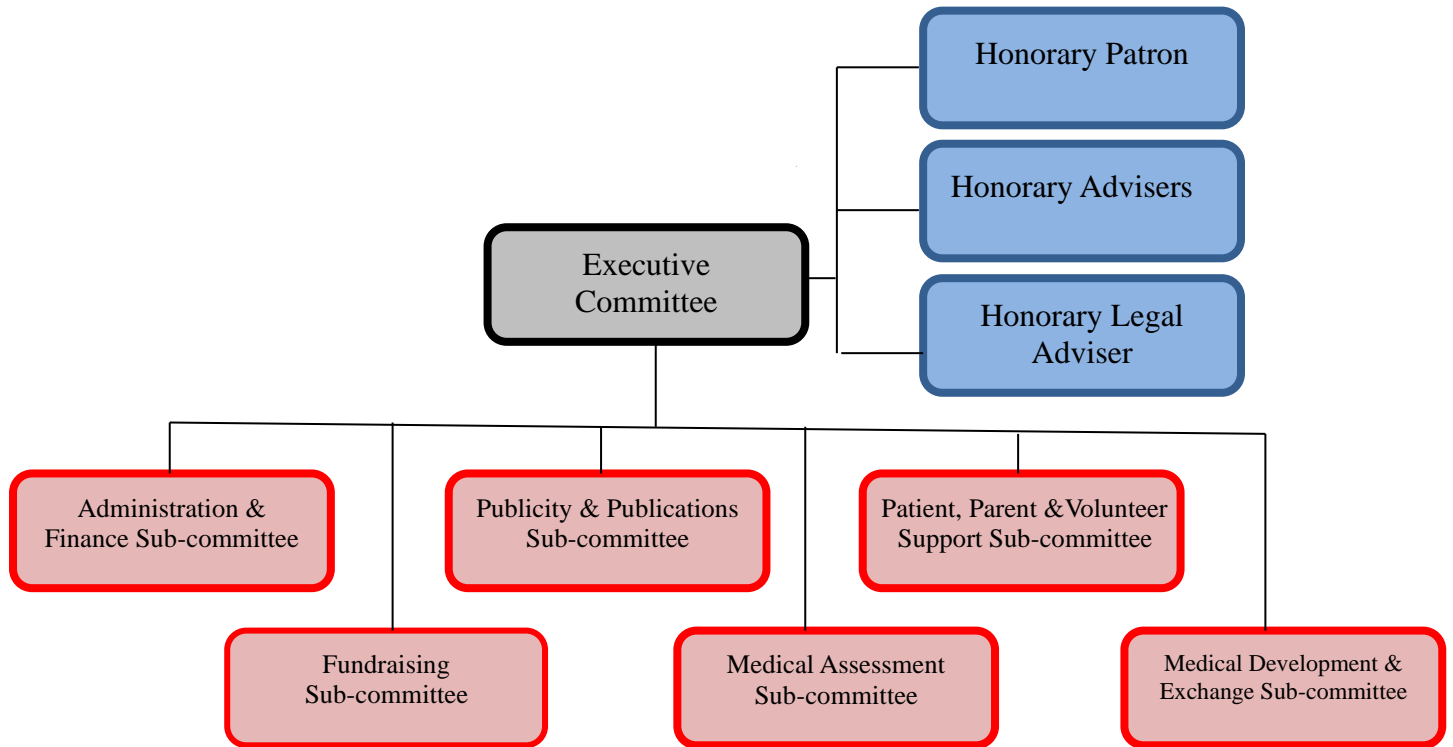
The CHF brings overseas surgeons and cardiologists to Hong Kong to share their experience with local medical staff. This is of vital importance as it helps staff keep up with all latest advances in treatment and medical technology.

The CHF also sponsors medical staff to receive further training and attend local and overseas seminars and conferences. Through Queen Mary Hospital, the CHF now provides funding so medical staff from Mainland China can receive training in Hong Kong.

### **10. Research**

The CHF provides funding for research into congenital heart disease with an aim to promote medical advancement.

## Chairman's Report

Members of CHF, ladies and gentlemen!

I wish to take this opportunity to deliver my Report to you all, Last year was a challenging year and I sincerely thank all our members for your active participation in the work of the Foundation.

Over the last year, the continuous social instability and economic downturn has placed unprecedented operational pressure on the Foundation. Our donation income has bore the brunt of this. The inability to hold our key annual event, the Heart to Heart Charity Walk, led to a significant drop in fundraising. In addition, our regular services such as House of the Heart, ward visit, summer activities, etc. have been suspended due to the Coronavirus epidemic. In this regard, we have to adjust from time to time members' services in order to maintain our operations.

All the generous donations we have received are even more commendable in the face of Hong Kong's economic crisis. The Foundation is especially grateful to several major sponsoring companies and organizations, including the Nu Skin Force For Good Foundation Hong Kong Chapter, New World Group Charity Foundation, AIA Foundation, Mast Industries (Far East) Ltd., Hasbro Far East Ltd., Ng Teng Fong Charitable Foundation Ltd., The Ohel Leah Synagogue Charity, and the American Women's Association of Hong Kong, whose continuous support is the basis for the stable services provided by the Foundation.

Since the outbreak of Coronavirus, the Foundation sincerely appreciates the donations of epidemic prevention materials from caring companies and individuals to alleviate the urgent needs of our members. The Foundation has initiated 5 donations of epidemic prevention materials, providing surgical masks, alcohol hand sanitizers, disinfectant spray, goggles, and other materials to 200 children with heart disease, 700 family members, and 124 medical staff. Our members feel extremely happy and comforted by this timely and generous assistance. We are grateful to join hands with all sectors to bring hope to groups facing difficulties. In the face of a severe epidemic, many members experienced anxiety or stress. In response, the Foundation has stepped up its case follow-up service, including providing telephone consultations, online small-group, and outreach services, with an enthusiastic response. These new services provided suitable channels for parents to express their emotions and share personal anti-epidemic information with each other to further the spirit of mutual self-help group.

With the resolution of the Foundation to strengthen the psychological support for its members, we will start providing psychological counseling, play therapy, and creative art

therapy services. Children with congenital heart disease (CHD) and their families face the threat of disease throughout their entire lives, and long-term hospitalization brings them pain and other negative emotions. We deeply understand that the CHD children face greater challenges with respect to their social and emotional development than other children and adolescents of the same age, and parents often develop anxiety, stress and uncertainties when caring for their children. As such, in place of the psychiatric diagnosis model of the public healthcare system, the Foundation will focus on prevention and psychological preparation by using psychological counseling and emotional therapies to deepen members' awareness of CHD and treatment procedures, in order to avoid negative emotions during treatment. These services will fill in the gaps in public healthcare. The Foundation is especially grateful to the Keswick Foundation for providing valuable sponsorship of this project.

The Pediatric Cardiology Department will be relocated to the Children's Hospital in Kai Tak at the end of 2020. The goal is to provide more comprehensive and "child-oriented" treatment for sick children. This is a milestone in the development of paediatric cardiological services in Hong Kong. The Foundation will continue to work closely with the Department of Paediatric Cardiology and sponsor the introduction of advanced CHD treatment, equipment, and technologies to improve the survival rate and effectiveness of treatment of sick children.

The pathology and treatment of CHD is complicated, and society lacks comprehensive information on it. In view of this, the Foundation has specially set up the "Doctors with You" project, inviting medical staff of the Department of Paediatric Cardiology to regularly share and exchange information about CHD with members through an online platform and answer related questions. The Foundation is sincerely grateful to the medical team of the Department of Paediatric Cardiology for their benevolence in carrying for the children and their families.

I am sincerely grateful to our team of workers: Thank you to Ms. Miriam HUNG and the staff team for their hard work and professionalism. I would also like to thank the Executive Committee members and all volunteers for their selfless dedication. On behalf of our members, I would like to thank each of the above.

Finally, as the only organization in Hong Kong serving CHD children and their families, the Foundation has an indispensable role and mission. Despite all difficulties ahead, this Foundation will continue to work hard, hold fast to our mission, and walk with the families of CHD children.

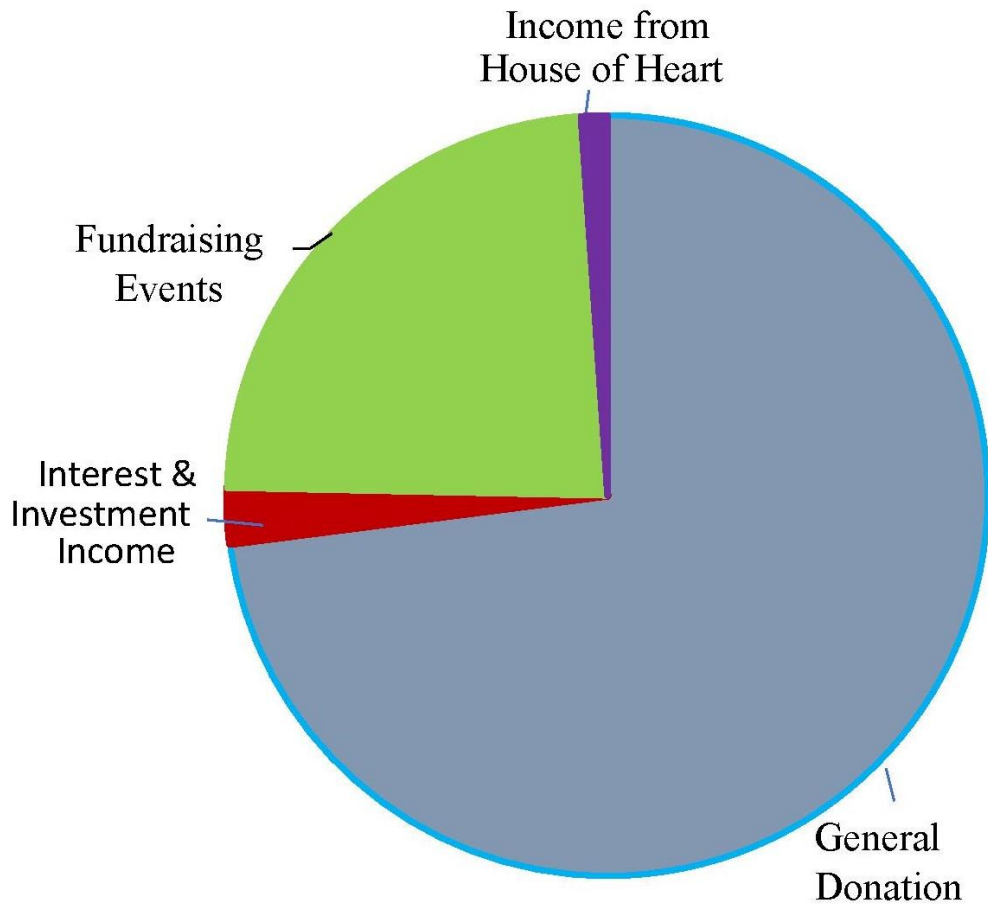

### Source of Overall Income 2019



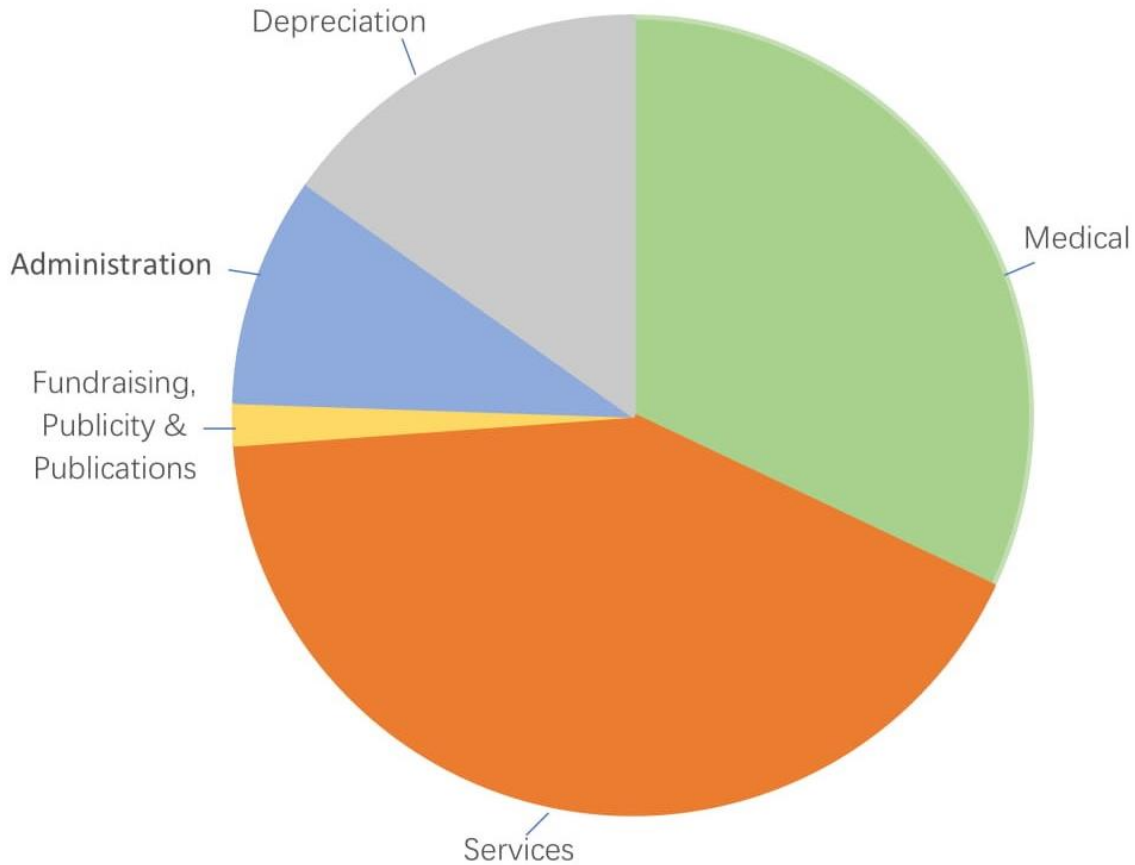

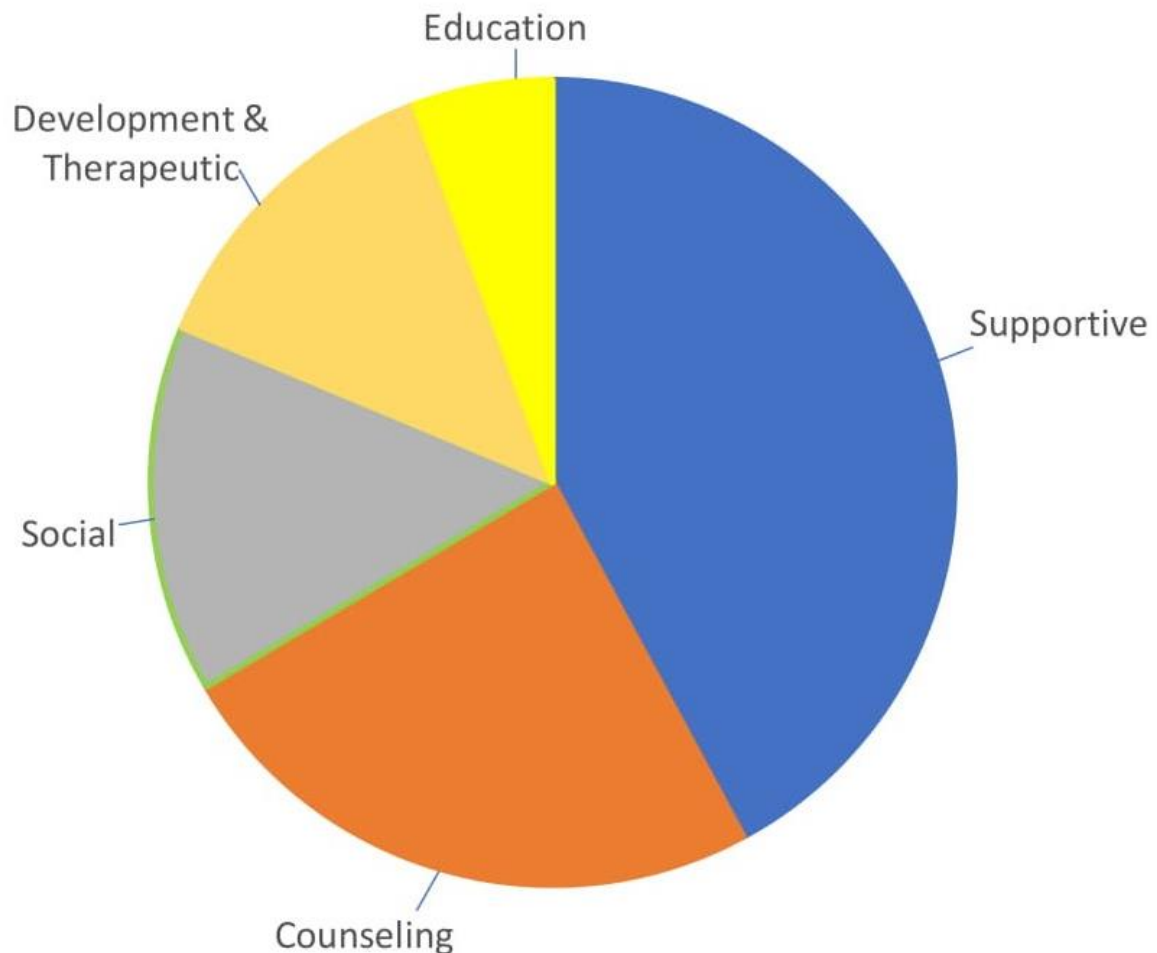

### Expenditure on Services 2019



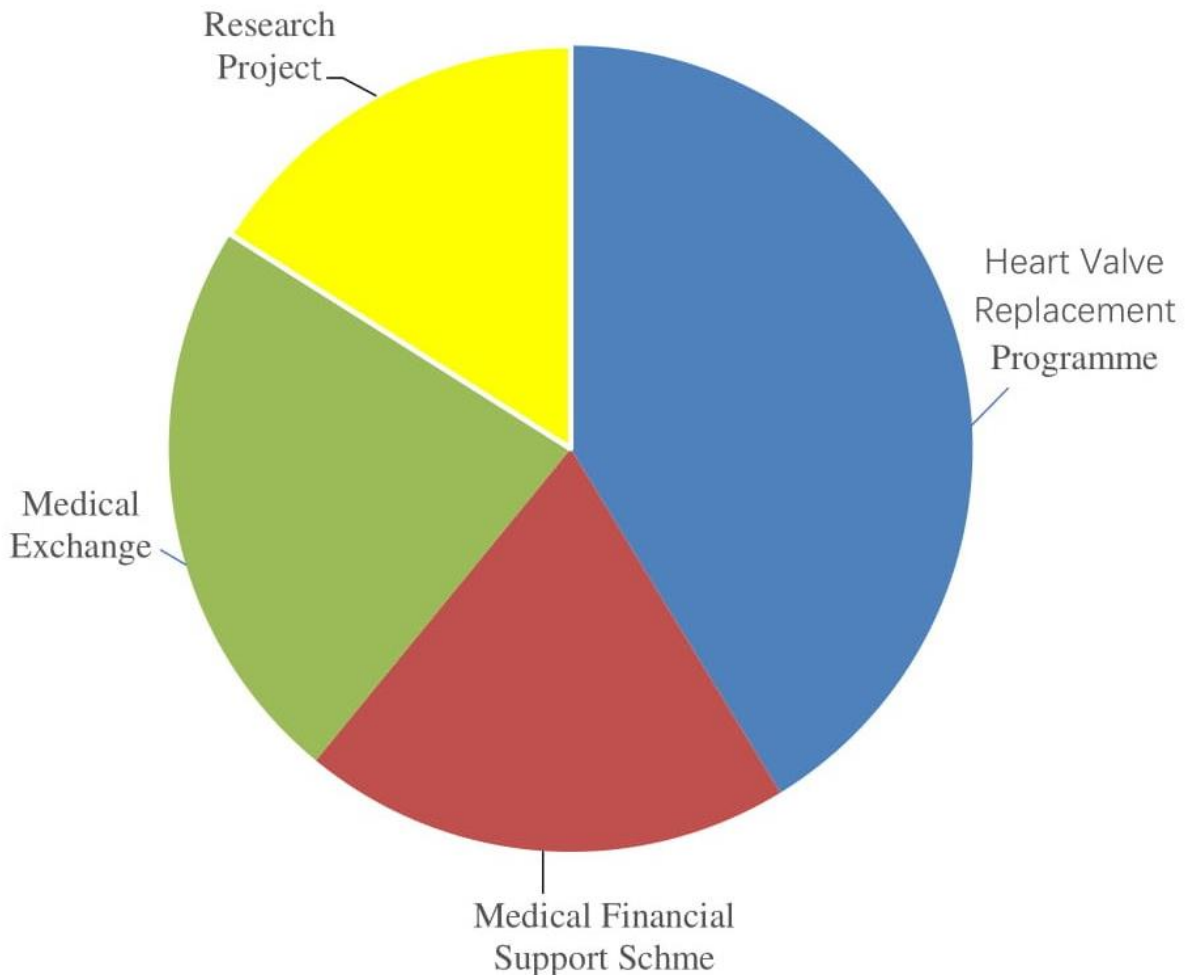

### Expenditure of Medical Sponsorship 2019



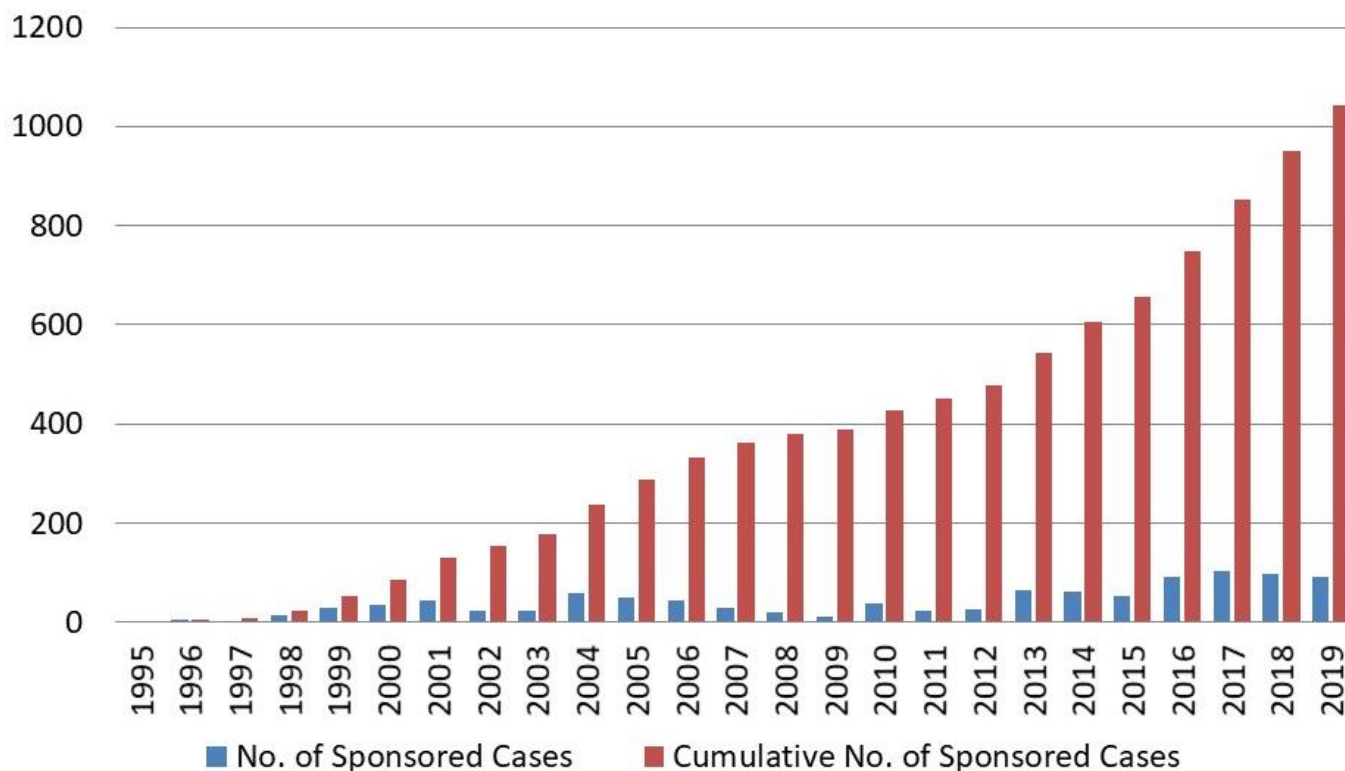

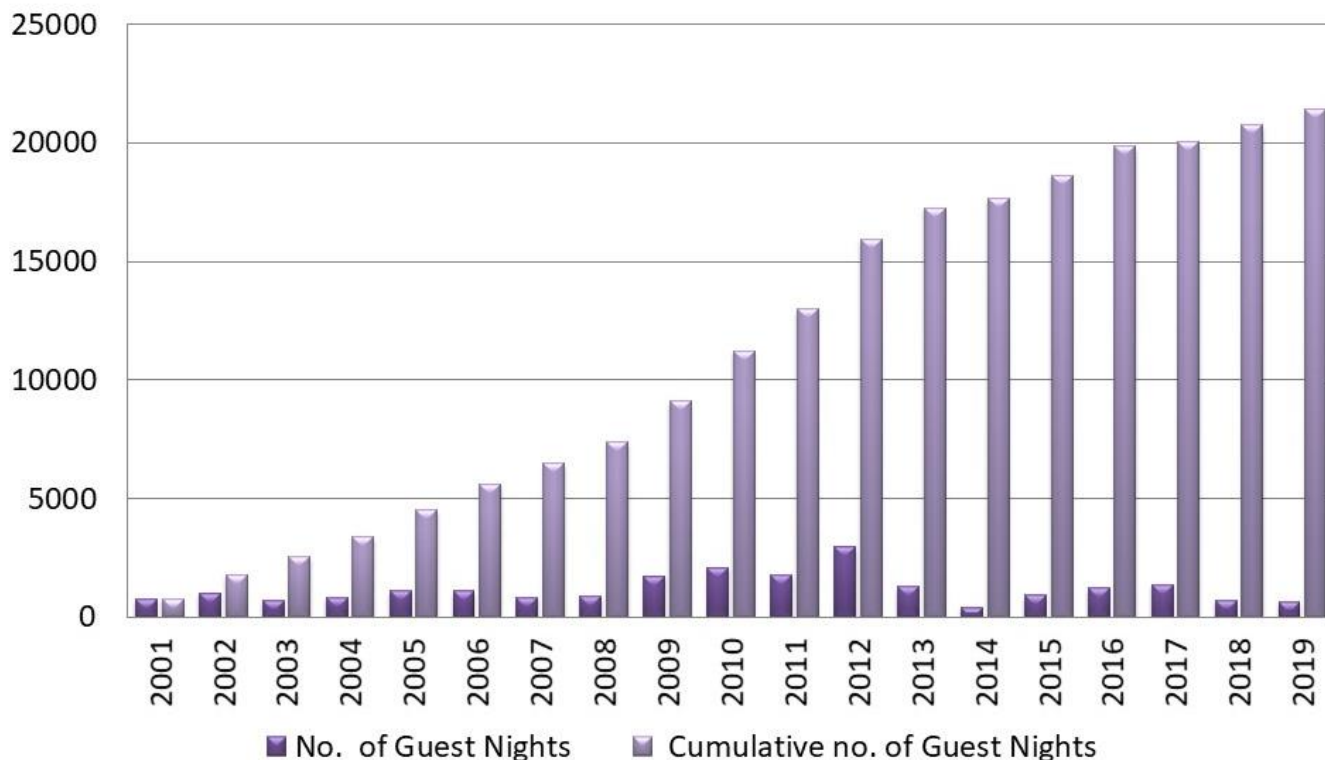
